

NEW FELLOWSHIP OPPORTUNITY! 2015 inaugurates Luce Scholars Program at the University of Hawai`i

The Luce Scholars Program is a nationally competitive fellowship program. It was launched by the Henry Luce Foundation in 1974 to enhance the understanding of Asia among potential leaders in American society.

The program provides stipends, language training, and individualized professional placement in Asia for 15-18 Luce Scholars each year.

The Program welcomes applications from college seniors, graduate students, and young professionals in a variety of fields who have had limited exposure to Asia. Applications must be made only through participating institutions.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

- U.S. citizens
- Must obtain a Bachelor's degree by July 2016
- Under 30 years of age by July 2016
- Not have spent more than 12 weeks in the Asian country of placement (No Asian Studies majors)

Luce Scholars have backgrounds in virtually every field other than Asian Studies, including but not limited to the arts, journalism, law, medicine, science, public health, environmental studies, business and international relations.

- 4. UH transcript
- 5. One letter of recommendation
