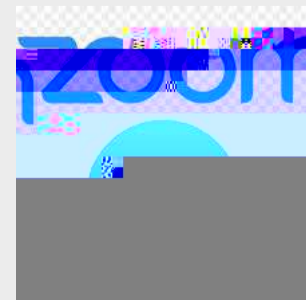
PEACE CORPS TO REER TALK-STORY: CIVIL AND ENVIRONMENTAL ENGINEERING
