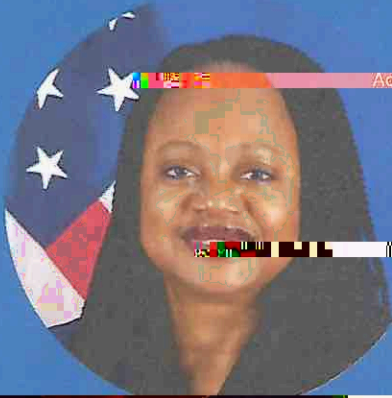

AMBASSADOR BONNIE DENISE JENKINS UNDER SECRETARY FOR ARMS CONTROL AND INTERNATIONAL SECURITY JULY 22, 2021 - PRESENT



Ambassador Bonnie Denise Jenkins, PhD has served as the Under Secretary for Arms Control and International Security since July 2021. She previously served, in the Obama Administration as Special Representative for Arms Control and International Security and Nonproliferation (ISN) from July 2009 until January 2017. Ambassador Jenkins coordinated U.S. efforts on threat reduction programs in chemical, biological, nuclear, and radiological (CBRN) security. She was the State Department lead for all four of the Nuclear Security Summits held from 2010 to 2016, as well as the U.S. Representative to the G7 Global Partnership Against the Threat of Nuclear and Chemical Weapons, the G8 High Level Panel of Experts on Nuclear and Chemical Weapons, and the G8 High Level Panel of Experts on Biological and Radiological Weapons. Before serving as Coordinator, she was a Legal Adviser to the U.S. Department of State and provided legal advice to treaty implementation bodies including the Chemical Weapons Convention, the Comprehensive Nuclear Test Ban Treaty, the Open Skies Treaty, the Conventional Forces in Europe Treaty, and the Biological Weapons Convention (BWC). She has worked with international institutions such as the International Atomic Energy Agency, the Office for the Prohibition of Chemical Weapons, the Geneva Convention on Certain Conventional Weapons, the Organization for the Prohibition of Chemical Weapons, Interpol, and the BWC Implementation Support Unit.

PhD. Following the State Department, she served as Senior Staff Director of the Senate Foreign Relations Committee. Previously, from 2007 - 2014, she was the National Security Advisor and Foreign Policy Advisor, and then Senior National Security Advisor, to Senate Majority/Minority Leader Harry Reid. Earlier, she was the Senior Foreign Policy Advisor to Senator Robert Menendez and, before that, the House International Relations Committee, Ranking Member Robert Menendez. She also worked as Manager, New Initiative Development, and as Manager, Net Corps America, at the Organization of American States. She holds a Ph.D. from the Kennedy School of Government, an M.A.T. degree from Johns Hopkins University, and a BA degree from Haverford College.
